BESS Underway

BESS is now starting and some crane companies have already completed training for the new Unit Standard. We can now put you in



contact with a list of assessors that is available from Tranzqual, the transport and warehousing Industry Training Organisation.

On Tranzqual's web site at:

www.tranzgual.org.nz/trainers-assessors/find-assessor.php you will find a form. Enter the Unit Standard number: 23436 into the search field.

We've agreed that there will be a transition period during which both the ex-Transit process and the new regime will be permitted. The relevant dates to note are:

After 31 March 2009

New candidates MUST achieve the new

Unit standards 23436

At 31 March 2011

ALL new AND existing BESS holders MUST hold the Unit standard.

Therefore all current holders of BESS have until 31 March 2011 to achieve the Unit Standard and new applicants from now until 31 March 2009 can choose to do it under the existing system or by achieving the Unit Standard. If they choose the latter they MUST still attain the Unit Standard by 31 March 2011. Please be aware that Opportunity – The Training Organisation will not be registering assessors - these will only be done through Tranzgual.

ADVISORY CIRCULAR QUEENSTOV



Subject: Crane Operations in the vicinity of Queenstown Airport

It is the responsibility of all employers to ensure that the contents of Security Notices, Safety Notices and Advisory Circulars are brought to the attention of all their staff and remain accessible to them.

INTRODUCTION

The unauthorised operation of cranes and other lifting equipment in the vicinity of Queenstown Airport could impose a serious hazard to the safety of aircraft, either as a physical obstruction or by interfering with electronic navigation equipment.

The risk to aircraft and their occupants, who are unaware of such obstacles when flying, could result in a collision with such equipment resulting in an accident. It is vital that any company or operator of cranes or other large obstacle understands the regulations governing the use of this equipment close to Queenstown Airport.

This advisory circular provides information that all persons responsible for cranes and lifting equipment must follow.

REQUIREMENTS AND PROCEDURES

Companies and contractors who have a requirement to operate cranes and lifting equipment within **6 kilometres** of Queenstown Airport's boundary and a height greater than **10 meters AGL** or that of the surrounding structures or trees, must receive prior permission from Queenstown Airport Corporation (QAC).

Rules controlling the erection or alteration of structures in the vicinity of Queenstown Airport are contained in:

- → Civil Aviation Rule 77 which is available at <u>www.caa.govt.nz</u>
- → Designation 4 of the Queenstown and Lakes District Plan www.qldc.govt.nz

The developer or crane operator should approach QAC at least **one month** in advance of the requirement to use a crane or other tall construction equipment, so any limitations and regulatory procedures can be complied with before work commences.

Depending on the height of the equipment, it may be necessary to apply to the Civil Aviation Authority (CAA) for a hazard determination in accordance with Civil Aviation Rule 77. In these cases, the Civil Aviation

Authority requires that the application be submitted **90 days** prior to the proposed date of construction or alteration.

Following the receipt of the Temporary Obstacle Application (QAC1-4130), QAC will conduct a risk assessment and advise the applicant of the outcome and any limitations imposed on the proposed operation. Only upon receipt of an approved application may the crane operator conduct operations.

A copy of the approved application must remain with the crane operator for the duration of its operation and must be produced if requested by a QAC official.

LOCATION AND PERMISSION

Section 1 of the **Temporary Obstacle Application Form (QAC1-4130)** must be completed in its entirety. The following information in extremely critical in the application and must be provided:

- → The Maximum Working height in Reduce Level (RL);
- The equipment's position with at least a six figure Northing and Easting reference;
- The radius of operation from the reference position; and
- → The Geodetic and Vertical Datum's used for the references.

In the situation where the crane or equipment is mobile, Northing and Easting references must be provided for each corner of the intended area of operation.

Once the application form, with Section 1 completed is received, QAC will consider the application and determine whether restrictions need to be applied. Any of the following conditions may be imposed to ensure the safety of aircraft:

- → The fitting of CAA Approved obstacle lights;
- Restrictions on operating times;
- Operations dependant on certain runways in use;
- Restrictions on operating height;
- Restrictions due to poor visibility.

NOTE: It may be necessary, in the event of an aircraft emergency, to have the equipment or obstruction lowered immediately.

Where the design of the crane or equipment allows, it should be lowered when not in use, or when requested by a QAC official. Where it cannot be lowered, it may be necessary for the jib to be parked in a specific direction when not in use.



Temporary Obstacle Application

NOTE: Any person intending to erect a temporary or permanent obstacle within the boundaries of the airport approach and land use controls as described Designation 4 of the Queenstown and Lakes District Plan, must formally apply to QAC for approval.

A minimum of 5 working days is required to process an application, however applicant submit this application at least one month prior to the intended date of operation. Refer to Queenstown Airport Advisory Circular 08110401 for more information.
